


Philanthropy in Action

Your philanthropy saved a life

Generous donors to the HonorHealth <u>Bob Bové Neuroscience Institute</u> make success stories like that of Olympian Amy Van Dyken-Rouen possible.

In 2014, a freak all-terrain vehicle accident altered her course.



Amy's spine was severed. She sustained several fractures to her back. She also suffered broken ribs, a head injury and a severe vascular injury. Her prognosis was anything but good.

Airlifted from the crash site to HonorHealth Scottsdale Osborn Medical Center, she was a Level I trauma patient. Neurosurgeon Luis M. Tumialán, MD, assessed Van Dyken-Rouen's injuries and quickly established a medical game plan.

Flanked by a cardiothoracic surgeon, trauma surgeons and other medical experts, Dr. Tumialán set out to do what seemed impossible at the time — save Amy's life. More than seven hours later, the team emerged from the operating room.

"Dr. Tumialán is the guy that saved my life," she said. "He was the neurosurgeon on call, and I'm really glad it was him. I know there's a reason he was there, just like I know there's a reason I'm still here."

Amy's well-documented journey of recovery was just beginning. But the life-saving care she received at HonorHealth gave her the chance to prove she still has the heart and tenacity of a champion.

Donors build new field for K-9 officer training

Thanks to the H.N. & Frances C. Berger Foundation, the HonorHealth K-9
Security Program is breaking ground on a new training field at the Shea Medical Center. This field will be used by our K-9 program and shared with additional law



enforcement K-9 agencies throughout Maricopa County.

Every day, around the clock, HonorHealth security officers and their highly trained canines patrol our medical centers ensuring a safe environment for patients, visitors and staff.

The new field will not only be level with durable AstroTurf, but fenced and lighted with a tree-shaded seating area for donors and spectators to observe training sessions. It will also boast an agility course with multiple training options for increased physical health.

"By upgrading the field, we can focus on the safety and maneuverability of the staff and dogs," states James Marconato, K-9 Security program supervisor. "HonorHealth also provides a community service that will in turn protect our K-9's, trainers, staff and patients, and allow us to support other local K-9 programs."

Chronic disease is on the rise, challenging doctors to find new ways to diagnose, treat and prevent the internal organ damage they cause. Endoscopy is a minimally invasive way to look inside body cavities or hollow organs with a small scope that offers a big picture.



The creation of the new **HonorHealth**

Interventional Endoscopy Center of Excellence brings together the expertise and resources that may help patients avoid the complications associated with surgery and expect faster recover times through the use of an endoscopy procedure.

A first-of-its-kind facility in Arizona, this center gives us the ability to assemble world class expertise, technology and tools to diagnose and treat diseases — typically beyond the scope of regular endoscopic techniques. The goal is to provide the highest level of care with a comprehensive and coherent patient experience that instills comfort, confidence and trust.

With the creation of this new center, clinical outcomes are expected to meet or exceed national benchmarks through this unique, multidisciplinary approach to patient care, including:

- Education and training, such as live endoscopy courses and a fellowship program
- Research including multi-center studies and collaboration with industry leaders
